Sutton Middle School is an International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program School. It is a program of international education designed to help students develop the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and skills necessary to participate actively and responsibly in a changing world.

Teacher Bio: Gervais was born and raised in Québec where he worked as a computer scientist before teaching French in Georgia. He has been teaching for seventeen years and has worked with students in grades K through 8. He holds a Master’s Degree in education from Central Michigan University.

Course Description: The program is based on proficiency and focuses on communications as it relates to the student’s daily life. Activities offer the students practice in all skill areas: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Each grammar point introduced is related to its function or role in communication.

Objectives:

1. Enable the students to use French effectively as a means of practical communication, providing a sound base of communication skills necessary for future study, work and leisure.
2. Enable the students to understand the nature of language and the process of total language learning, which comprises the integration of linguistic, cultural and social components.
3. Enable the students to develop an appreciation of a variety of literary and non-literary texts.
4. To offer an insight into the cultural characteristics of communities where French is spoken.
5. To encourage an awareness and understanding of the perspectives of people from other cultures.
6. To promote involvement with different communities, where relevant.
7. To provide access to varied sources of information.
8. To foster curiosity, a lifelong interest and enjoyment in language learning.
9. To increase the students’ general knowledge by using French as a vehicle for learning across the curriculum.
10. To enhance the students’ general learning and thinking skills.

Textbooks: *T’es branché?*, *À la page* (supplemental reading material), poems, short stories, dialogues, and situational cards.

Supplies:

- Three-ring binder (1” thick) with 3 separators or a section in a bigger binder for French with 3 separators.
- French/English – English/French dictionary for home use (Barnes & Noble, etc.) **or** online access to www.wordreference.com.
- One dry erase marker.
- Basic school supplies such as pencils, pen, and loose-leaf college ruled paper.
